(Three year Degree Course)

a) Course Profile

Affiliated to H.P. University Shimla, we are offering BCA course at your door steps. BCA is a three year degree course. The total No. of seats in BCA course are 50. The distribution of seats is as under:

b) Eligibility Conditions

Candidate who has passed (10+2) examination from HPBOSE/CBSE/ICSE or any other examination considered equivalent by HPU with 40% marks (35% marks for SC/ST category) shall be eligible for taking entrance test conducted by the college.

c) Age limit

Maximum age limit for admission to BCA course is 21 years for general category, 24 years for SC/ST category and 23 years for girls candidate as on Ist July, 2021. The vice chancellor of HPU may permit age relaxation upto maximum of three months.

Note: Due to Covid-19 Pandemic, Admission will be made purely on 10+2 merit basis or as per the direction of Govt. of Himachal Pradesh/H.P. University Shimla.

BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (BBA)

(Three year Degree Course)

a) Course Profile

The course of Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) is being offered in the institution under self-financing scheme and regulated through the Higher Education Institute Society, Govt. College Ghumarwin (H.P.) Regd. Under Cooperative Society Act 2006 (Act xxv of 26. The duration of BBA degree course is three years spread over in six semesters. The BBA degree course is affiliated with Himachal Pradesh University Shimla. The basic objective to start this course in this institution is to impart quality education in management to the candidates admitted for the course for equipping themselves to build their career and ultimately become a good citizen of country.

b) Eligibility Conditions

Candidates who have passed 10+2 examination from HPSE Board/CBSE/ICSE or any other examinations considered equivalent to 10+2, by HPU with 45% marks (40% marks for SC/ST Categories) shall be eligible as per HP University rule.

c) Age Limit

Maximum age limit for admission in BBA Ist Semester Degree Course is 22 years on 1st July, 2021 provided that in case of the candidates belonging to Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes, the upper age limit will be relaxed by three years. Provided further that the Vice-Chancellor shall have the power to permit age relaxation for reasons to be recorded in writing up to a maximum of three months.

Note: Due to Covid-19 Pandemic, Admission will be made purely on 10+2 merit basis or as per the direction of Govt. of Himachal Pradesh / H.P. University Shimla.

POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN COMPUTER APPLICATION (PGDCA)

a) Course Profile

The duration of PGDCA course is one year, spread over two semesters and examination will be held at the end of each semester. The total number of seats in PGDCA Course are 40. The distribution of seats is as under

a) Eligibility Conditions

A candidate who has passed Bachelor degree in any discipline with atleast 50% marks (45% marks in case of SC/ST candidates) from a university established by law in India.

b) Age limit

Candidate seeking admission in PGDCA programme shall not be more that 26 years for male candidate 28 years for female candidate and 29 years for SC/ST candidate as on Ist July, 2021.

Note:- The admission will be made purely on graduation marks basis. The students who want to take admission in PGDCA are directed to apply within 10 days after the declaration of Graduation result/as per the dates notified by the Institution.

Semester system and Choice Based Credit System.

The Indian Higher Education Institutions have been moving from the conventional annual system to semester system. Currently many of the institutions have already introduced the choice based credit system, the semester system accelerates the teaching-learing process and enables vertical and horizontal mobility in learning. The credit based semester system provides flexibility in designing curriculum and assigning credits based on the course content and hours of teaching. The choice based credit system provides a 'cafeteria' type approach in which the students can take courses of their choice, learn at their own pace, undergo additional courses and acquire more than the required credits, and adopt an interdisciplinary approach to learning. It is desirable that the HEIs move to CBCS and implement the grading system.

ANTI RAGGING/DISCIPLINE RULES

In order to have zero tolerance and its total elimination from educational institutions, Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its orders dated 4th May, 2001, 16th May 2007 and 11th Feb, 2009 has directed as here under:

- 1. Ragging is banned in the institution.
- 2. Anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. Punishment shall be exemplary and justifiably harsh.
- 3. Punishment for ragging includes:
 - i) Imprisonment, fine or both
 - ii) Expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for limited period or fine with a public apology.
 - iii) With holding scholarships or other benefits.
 - iv) Debarring from representation on participation in events.
 - v) With holding of results.
 - vi) Suspension or expulsion for hostel or mess and the like.
- 4. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging/indiscipline in the past or if it is

noticed later that he has indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he/she will be expelled from the institution forthwith.

HOSTEL

The college has a Girls Hostel with a capacity to accommodate 91 students. Hostel is allotted on academic merit basis. The following rules are to be observed strictly by the hostel inmates:

The Hostel warden appoints a hostel Prefect who looks after the discipline and daily attendance of the girls.

- * The mess is run on cooperative basis.
- * No inmate is allowed to use electric appliances in the room.
- * Entry of outsiders in the hostel is strictly prohibited.
- * Use of drugs or intoxicants, smoking and ragging in the hostel are offences which can result in the eviction of the offender from the hostel.
- * Pets are not allowed in the hostel
- * No boarder is allowed to proceed to her native place without prior permission of Hostel warden
- * On leaving / vacating the hostel, the boarder shall have to procure a "No Dues Certificate" from the Hostel.
