5. The admission will be purely provisional, and will be cancelled at any stage, if the information submitted online is found incorrect.

With these words, I welcome you to the fascinating world of Retail, Hospitality & Tourism sector and wish you all the best in all your future endeavours.





An Introduction

Named after Swami Vivekanand, a great visionary, spiritual leader, the college was established with the notification of the state Govt. on July 1, 1994 for running arts faculty only. The majestic and well designed building of the college was built by the ACC and was handed over in 1999. Science and Commerce faculties were started in 1998. The college is affiliated to H.P. University and was given due recognition under UGC section of 12(B) in 2008 and 2 (f) in 2009. Two new vocational courses BCA and PGDCA were started in 2009 under the self-financing scheme. In the year 2012, M.A. English was started. In the same year another vocational course B.B.A. was started under self financing scheme. Two more PG courses M.Sc. Physics and M.Sc. Mathematics were introduced in 2017, M.A. Political Science & M.Com. in 2019 and M. Sc. Chemistry, M. Sc. Botany and M. Sc. Zoology were also introduced in 2020. For increasing the employability among young generations, our institution is going to start B.Voc. programme in i) Retail Management and ii) Hospitality and Tourism from academic session 2021-22. In the year 2020, NAAC team visited the college and the college is re-accredited as 'B Grade' institution. At present the college is spread over 73.11 bighas of land. The entire campus of the college is under CCTV surveillance and is connected to Wi-Fi and Broadband Internet system.

The college is dedicated to the cause of learning by imparting education to inculcate a sense of responsibility & devotional service among the students. The college provides a blend of academic, cultural, sports and intellectual resources. It also brings to the students a dynamic environment for the overall development of their personalities, aspirations and talents. Today, the college is known as one among the finest institutions in the state for Sciences, Humanities and Commerce. The college has registered a tremendous growth in enrolment. At present about three thousand students, coming from far-flung rural areas, are studying various UG and PG courses being run by this college.

The college has well-furnished laboratories in the Science faculty and also in the Departments of Geography, Music and Computer Applications. It has a girls' hostel having a capacity to accommodate 91 girl students. It has its own well-furnished gymnasium, a boxing ring, Playground, Examination hall, as well as a well equipped conference Hall. The college has a well-stocked library.

Over the years, the college has shown consistently very good results as compared to H.P.U. pass percentage and every year students of this college get positions in the merit lists notified by H.P.

Admission Rules

GENERAL ADMISSION RULES.

- 1) Admission will be made on the recommendation of admission committee.
- 2) All admissions will be provisional subject to the approval of vice-chancellor, HPU, Shimla.
- 3) Admission will be strictly on the fulfillment of eligibility of candidate as fixed by HPU Shimla/HP Govt.
- 4) Every candidates seeking admission in any class of the college will be required to pay Rs. 300/- towards PTA fund. Fees & funds once deposited will not be refunded.
- 5) A candidate having a gap of one or two years in their studies will have to submit an affidavit explaining the reason.
- 6) A candidate **disqualified/expelled/rusticated** from other institution/University will not be admitted to any course during his/her disqualification period. (HPU ordinance 3.6)
- 7) The principal reserves the right to disallow or cancel any admission if conduct of the student has not been up to the mark during previous years.

Admission Procedure

- ❖ Every candidate seeking admission to first semester shall have to apply online all the prescribed form available on college website: www.gcghumarwin.org.in, before specified date.
- ❖ Since the no. of seats in each course are limited the admission will be made strictly on the basis of marks secured in 10+2 class. All the candidates are required to appear in person in centralized counseling on the dates allotted failing which their admission form will be rejected and the seat will be given to the next in candidate in the merit form during specified dates of admission.

ADMISSION PROCESS FOR B.VOC. 2nd SEMESTER onwards:

For admission to 2nd semester onwards, roll on system will be applicable. The students of this college who have appeared in examination will have to take admission in the next semester without waiting for result before the last date of admission. No candidate will be admitted in the college after the specified date of admission schedule.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED:

- a) Original certificates along with photocopies of all the certificate of matric onward examination. Fresh candidate must submit/upload two copies of academic certificate and character certificate/school leaving certificate.
- b) Three passport size photographs.
- c) Character certificate from institution last attended or issued by Gram Panchayat Pradhan or by some H.P. Gazetted class I officer, in case student is seeking admission to the first semester of any course or an applicant from any other college/university seeking admission in any of the courses.
- d) Fresh candidate seeking admission to I Sem. must submit enrolment form complete in all respects.
- e) An affidavit in case of gap.
- f) Category certificate for SC/ST/OBC/IRDP/EWS/Ward of Ex-servicemen/PWD candidate.
- g) Board equivalence certificate for the candidate passing +2 class from other than H.P. Board.

At the time of appearing before admission committee, the applicant should submit hard copy of online submitted form complete in all respects with required documents in the following sequence :-

- 1. Admission form
- 2. PTA Enrolment form
- 3. Attested copies of academic documents.
- 4. HPU enrolment form with attested matriculation and 10+2 certificate to be submitted separately.
(In case seeking admission in first semester)
- 5. Character certificate (in case of fresh admission)
- 9. Copy of Aadhar Card
- 10. Bonafied Himachal Certificate (Only for Bonafide Himachal girls)
- 11. Migration Certificate (Only if 10+2 passed the board other than HPBOSE).

ABOUT THE BACHELOR OF VOCATION (B.Voc.) DEGREE PROGRAMME

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has launched a scheme on skill development based job oriented higher education program as a part of College/University education, leading to Bachelor of

Vocation (B.Voc.) degree. This degree Program is unique with the provision of multiple entry and exist at different levels of NSQF from level 5 to 7, viz. Diploma/Advance Diploma and Degree in compliance to the National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF). Multiple entry and exit will allow students the flexibility to earn and study as per their convenience. This is further explained in the Prospectus.

OBJECTIVES

- ❖ To provide multiple entry and exit options at various levels through program design in conformation to the skill eco system.
- ❖ To create requisite job role specific skilled manpower for industry at various NSQF levels as per NOS's (National Occupational Standards).
- ❖ To empower the youth leading to employment and income generating opportunities.
- ❖ To provide judicious mix of skills relating to a profession and appropriate content of general education.
- ❖ To provide flexibility to the students by means of pre-defined entry and multiple exit levels.
- ❖ To integrate skill based NSQF complaint vocational studies with the undergraduate level of higher education in order to enhance employability of the graduates and meet the industry requirements. Such graduates apart from meeting the needs of local and national industry are also expected to be competent to become part of the global workforce.

COURSE STRUCTURE

B. Voc. programme is designed with the provision for multiple exit levels. All the candidates enrolled for diploma courses or further will be treated at par from the second semester onwards. Students may exit after six months with the certificate (NSQF Level 4) or they may continue for diploma or advance diploma level courses leading to B. Voc. Degree.

MULTIPLE ENTRY AND EXIT OPTIONS:

- ❖ After the completion of Semester I, the candidate will get a Certificate, and she/he may go for a job or continue studying.

- ❖ The candidate may rejoin Semester II. After the completion of Semester II, the candidate will get a Diploma, and she/he may go for a job or continue studying.
- ❖ The candidate may rejoin Semester III. After the completion of Semesters III and IV, the candidate will get an Advanced Diploma, and she/he may go for a job or continue studying.
- ❖ The candidate may rejoin Semester V. After the completion of Semesters V and VI, the candidate will be awarded a B.Voc. degree, and she/he may go for a job or become an entrepreneur, or continue studying for the M.Voc. Degree (NSQF Level 8 onwards) and can register for Ph.D. degree (NSQF Level 10) after it in Vocational studies, or they can take admission in any other masters' programme after completion of required Bridge course, or appear in any competitive exams conducted by State Public Service Commission and Union Public Service Commission.

INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME

- ❖ In every level there will be internship at the end of the semester / Year. Internship is an integral/essential component of B. Voc. degree.
- ❖ The Internship shall also carry credits to be added in the final evaluation of skill components.
- ❖ **HPKVN (Himachal Pradesh Kaushal Vikas Nigam)** is fully sponsoring the internship apart from facilitating the skill component (60) of this programme along with courseware for whole of the programme.
- ❖ Candidates enrolled for this programme are entitled for 'Kaushal Vikas Bhatta' of Rs. 1000/- per month as per state government policy as per state government policy.

- After the completion of the second semester, the student will get a combined “Team Leader” Diploma in the Retail Management sector from Retailers Association's Skill Council of India (RASCI) and Himachal Pradesh University. The candidate may get an opportunity to work in any retail- related industry.
- After the completion of the second year, the student will get a combined “Departmental Manager” Advanced Diploma in the Retail Management sector from Retailers Association's Skill Council of India (RASCI) and Himachal Pradesh University. The candidate may work as a skilled resource in the related field as well as explore opportunities to become an entrepreneur.
- After the completion of the third year, the student will get a Degree Certificate from the Himachal Pradesh University. The candidate may become a “Store Manager” in retail-related industries as well as explore opportunities to become an entrepreneur.

HOSPITALITY & TOURISM

- After the completion of the first semester, the student will get a “Front Office Associate” Certificate in the Hospitality & Tourism sector from Tourism and Hospitality Skill Council (THSC). The candidate may work as a certified resource in any hospitality and tourism-related industry.
- After the completion of the second semester, the student will get a combined “Front Office Executive” Diploma in the Hospitality & Tourism sector from Tourism and Hospitality Skill Council (THSC) and Himachal Pradesh University. The candidate may get an opportunity to work in any Hospitality & Tourism-related industry.
- After the completion of the second year, the candidate will get a combined “Guest Relations Manager” Advanced Diploma in the Hospitality & Tourism sector from Tourism & Hospitality Skill Council (THSC) and Himachal Pradesh University. The candidate may work as a skilled resource in the related field as well as explore opportunities to become an entrepreneur.
- After the completion of the third year, the student will get a Degree Certificate from the Himachal Pradesh University. The candidate may become a “Duty Manager” in the Hospitality & Tourism-related industries as well as explore opportunities to become an entrepreneur

ON THE JOB TRAININGS

On Job Training of trainees of B.Voc. is an immense part of the curriculum to give students/trainee exposure of industry practices. After every semester, the students have to undergo On the Job Training (OJT) as per their level of B.VOC in the relevant Industry.

The OJT helps the trainee:

- ❖ To get familiar with the work environment, modern tools and systems.
- ❖ To participate in teamwork- preferably as part of a multi-disciplinary team.
- ❖ To improve their communication skills.
- ❖ To understand the professional and ethical responsibilities of an employee.
- ❖ To make contacts for future employment.

CONDITIONS FOR ADMISSION

ELIGIBILITY CONDITIONS

- ❖ Admission to the B Voc. programme will be as per the rules and regulations of the Himachal Pradesh University.
- ❖ The eligibility criteria for admission to the B. Voc. degree programme shall be 10+2 in all streams from a recognized board;10+2 examination or an examination equivalent thereof from a Board/University established by law in India with English as a compulsory subject with 45% marks in aggregate, OR any examination of a University/ Board/ College or School in a foreign country recognized as equivalent for the above purpose by the Vice-Chancellor/ Equivalence Committee on its own, OR on the recommendation of Association of India Universities with 45 marks OR as per eligibility norms of the college for admission to undergraduate courses in case of center of excellence.
- ❖ Vocational subjects under NSQF will be given weightage, equivalent to any other general education subject while considering admission to students to the undergraduate courses as per reference no. DD No. 1-52/2013(CC/NSQF) dated 30.04.2014 of UGC.
- ❖ Maximum age limit for admission to B.Voc. Courses is 23 years for general category, 25 years for SC/ST category and 25 years for girl candidates, as on July 1 of the admission year. The Vice Chancellor may permit age relaxation as per norms.

- ❖ Reservation rules are applicable as per the rules or guidelines of the Himachal Pradesh Government.
- ❖ Students belonging to SC/ST category shall be given a relaxation in marks for admission purpose, i.e., they would require a minimum of marks in aggregate at 10+2 level.
- ❖ Compartment students shall not be allowed admission in the B.Voc. programmes.
- ❖ A candidate cannot pursue two full time undergraduate courses simultaneously.
- ❖ The University reserves the right to cancel any admission at any stage.
- ❖ In matters relating to undergraduate admissions, the decision of the Admission Committee/Vice-Chancellor, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, shall be final.
- ❖ All legal matters pertaining to undergraduate admissions shall be subject to the Himachal Pradesh jurisdiction only.

MODE OF SELECTION

- ❖ Admission to the B.Voc. programme in Retail Management and Hospitality & Tourism (Semester-I) shall be done purely on the merit in the qualifying examination (10+2 etc.) .
- ❖ There are three categories of candidates who shall be given admission in Semester-I of the skill-based courses under NSQF.

Category 1: Students who have already acquired NSQF certification Level 4 in a particular Industry sector may opt for admission in the skill-based courses under NSQF.

Note: Regarding selection of students for B.Voc. programme, 10 extra weightage shall be given to Category-1; 5 extra weightage shall be given to Category-2 in 10+2 examination. Final list of students shall be finalized on merit.

- Last date to accept the application for these scholarships will be notified by the Government/College.

Identity & Library Card & Neck Lanyard

While in college campus, every student will be required to carry a ribbon identity card obtained from the library duly authenticated by the college authorities. He/She has to show the card as and when demanded. In case the card is lost a duplicate card will be issued at the cost 20/-. The student will him/her self be responsible if his/her card is misused in bus pass, library or any other activities.

LIBRARY

The college has a well stocked library and periodical section/reading room. The college library has been authorized as national library and information service infrastructure for scholarly content N-List. The programme provided access to more than 6000 journals and more than 31,35,000 E-books. Library management software SOUL-2.0 has been installed to automate entire housekeeping operation of the library.

Rules: -

- 1) Reference books are not issued.
- 2) A maximum of two books will be issued on the identity card of each student.
- 3) Books are issued for one month. If the books are not returned within due date a fine of Rs. 1/- per book per day will be charged.
- 4) If a student mutilates or defaces a book - a fine and the cost of the book will have to be deposited.

Leave Rules

- 1) Student will have to apply for leave.
- 2) Concerned teacher can recommend leave for three days.
- 3) For more than 3 days the chief tutor will sanction the leave on the recommendation of the tutor.
- 4) In case of illness lasting more than 6 days the medical certificate from the doctor will have to be submitted.
- 5) A student who remains absent without leave for more than 10 days his/her name will be struck off from the attendance register. In that case the student will have to seek re-admission.
- 6) The application must be got sanctioned by the applicant himself/herself and applicant must ensure that the concerned subject teacher noted down the leave.
- 7) A student whose name has been struck off twice will not be eligible for re-admission.
- 8) Students who go for participation in various inter-college games or other competition will have to get their leave sanctioned and noted by the subject teachers before their departure for the participation.
- 9) Leave during house examination will be sanctioned by the principal after the recommendation of the concerned subject teachers in special cases only.
- 10) There will be no fine for the leave period, but the students will have to fulfil the condition of lecture attendance.

Extra Curricular Activities

The college student can participate in extracurricular activities like youth festival, sports meets and other cultural programmes from time to time.

1. **NCC** infantry wing is operational in the college for both boys and girls. Only eligible cadets can appear in "BEE" and "CEE" certificate exam.
2. Apart from these are three units of **NSS** in which about 200 volunteers participate every year. NSS camps inculcate spirit of social service among the student in order to give exposure to the students.
3. **Rovers & Rangers** activities of Bharat Scouts and Guide are also operational. A student can opt any one activity.
4. Educational tours are conducted during vacations.

Detailed information can be obtained from the teacher in charge of different wings.

Career Guidance And Counseling:

The college provides special facilities to students for getting career information and vocational guidance best suited to their aptitude, interests and other related factors. The cell also provides information regarding the opportunities for higher, general and professional education in India and abroad, scholarship, fellowship, apprenticeship, search and travel grants, competitive examination, job opportunities, employment outlook etc. Students are advised in their own interest to contact the Bureau personally before making a final choice of their careers and courses of studies. The Bureau welcomes enquiries regarding the world of work. Detailed information can be obtained from the teachers in charge of different wings.

College Magazine:

College magazine "PARIJAT" is published every year to cultivate writing skills amongst the students of the college. It has sections viz, English, Hindi Science, Commerce, Planning forum, Sanskrit and Pahari. Vocational Students may submit their self-composed articles to the staff editors of respective sections for publication in the college magazine.

Parent Teachers Association:

PTA was established in the year 1999 with the objective to have participation of the parents, teachers and the students for all round development of the institution. PTA provides assistance to the needy and deserving students and honours the meritorious students. The annual membership fee is Rs. 200/- . The election for the executive committee will be Held as per decision of college management.

Old Students Association: Old students association was established in 2011 with a view to have interaction between the old & existing students, OSA also provides financial help to needy &

deserving students of the college. The annual general meeting is held on last Sunday of Dec. every year.

Annual Prize Distribution Function:

The prize distribution function of the college is held annually towards the end of the academic year in the month of February, in which the prizes & medals and certificates of Merit are awarded to the students winning distinctions in academics and cultural activities, NCC and sports during the academic session.

Hostel For Girls And Boys:

A girls' hostel is functioning in the college campus having 91 seats. Selection is made on the basis of merit & reservation norms. Only undergraduate students can apply for the hostel and detailed information can be sought from the hostel warden.

Anti Ragging Squad/Proctorial Committee:

According to the Himachal Pradesh Education Institution (Prohibition of ragging) ordinance, 2010 no person shall practice ragging in any form, within or outside premises of an educational institution. Any person who contravenes the provisions of subsection (1) shall on conviction be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to three years or with fine which may extend to 50 thousand rupees or both.

Any complaint of ragging should be brought immediately to the knowledge of Principal or Warden, member of anti-ragging squad or police by student or his/her parent. If the individuals, committing or abetting ragging are not identified, collective punishment can be given.

Discipline:

College is a silence zone. The academic atmosphere of the college should not be disturbed by ringing mobile bells/songs or by raising slogans in the campus. Students are expected to conform to certain norms of decent behavior in and out of the college. They are well advised not to pollute the atmosphere of the college in any way. Those who indulge in acts of indiscipline would invite disciplinary action such as reprimand, imposition of fine, suspension or expulsion, depending upon the gravity of indiscipline indulged in. Smoking and use of other tobacco products is a punishable offence under law so, its use is strictly banned in the college campus. The offender will be penalized accordingly.

Dress Code:

It is mandatory for B. Voc Students to adhere to the following dress code :

- (1) Black Coat (Having Logo of College)
- (2) White Shirt, Blue & Grey Tie
- (3) Black Pent.

College Fees And Funds:

1. All annual charges will be charged at the time of admission to 1st. 3rd and 5th Semester along with monthly charges for six months.
2. Fee once deposited will not be refunded.
3. Library security can be taken within one year of leaving the college otherwise, it will lapse.
4. Special fines can be imposed by the college.
