#### b) Eligibility Conditions

- i) Candidate who has passed (10+2) examination from HPBOSE/CBSE/ICSE or any other examination considered equivalent by HPU with 40% marks (35% marks for SC/ST category) shall be eligible for taking entrance test conducted by the college.
- c) **Age Limit**: Maximum age limit for admission to BCA course is 21 years for general category, 24 years for SC/ST category and 23 years for girls candidate as on 1st July.2022. The Vice-Chancellor of HPU may permit age relaxation up to maximum of three months.

#### BACHELOR OF BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION (BBA)

(Three year Degree Course)

#### a) Course Profile

The course of Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) is being offered in the institution under self-financing scheme and regulated through the Higher Education Institute Society, Govt. Collage Ghumarwin (H.P.) Regd. Under Cooperative Society Act 2006 (Act xxv of 26). The duration of BBA degree course is three years spread over in six semesters. The BBA degree course is affiliated with Himachal Pradesh University Shimla. The basic objective to start this course in this institution is to impart quality education is management to the candidates admitted for the course for equipping themselves to build their career and ultimately become a good citizen of country.

- c) **Age Limit**: Maximum age limit for admission in BBA 1st Semester Degree Course is 22 years on 1st July, 2022 provided that in case of the candidates belonging to Scheduled Caster/Scheduled Tribes, the upper age limit will be relaxed by three years. Provided further that the Vice- Chancellor shall have the power to permit age relaxation upto a maximum of three months.

### POST GRADUATE DIPLOMA IN COMPUTER APPLICATION (PGDCA)

a) **Course Profile**: The duration of PGDCA course is one year, spread over two semester. a The total number of seats in PGDCA Course are 40. The distribution of seats is as under.

#### b) Eligibility Conditions

**Age Limit**: Maximum age limit of a candidate seeking admission in PGDCA programme is 26 years for male candidate, 28 years for female candidate, and 29 years for SC/ST candidate as on 1st July, 2022.

Note:- The admission will be made purely on marks obtained in graduation. The students who want to take admission in PGDCA are directed to apply within 10 days after the declaration of their result/as per the dates notified by the Institution.

## **Guidelines for Entrance Test**

# ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO BCA: (SUBSIDIZED SEATS) BASIS OF ADMISSION (BCA)

The admission to BCA is based on competitive examination for 20 subsidized seats. The competitive test shall comprise of three parts e.g. Mathematics (40%), Logical Ability (40%) and General Awareness (20%)

Note: Separate Merit Lists shall be prepared for subsidized category and Non-Subsidized category.

**NON- SUBSIDIZED SEATS:** For Non-Subsidized seats admission shall be based on marks obtained in entrance test/ the percentage of marks scored in Matric and 10+2 exam passed (carrying equal weightage). The candidates on merit depending upon the number of seats, shall be admitted to the course and there will not be any kind of reservation.

# **BASIS OF ADMISSION (BBA)**

The admission to subsidized seats is based on entrance test (comprising of four parts e.g. General English, General Mathematics, General Knowledge and genera Management).

- 1. **Application Ratings:** (15 Marks each for Matric and 10+2 examination levels on the basis of percentage scored in the examination. While computing merit a candidate having commerce or Mathematics as a subject at 10+2 Level will be given additional weightage of 10% of the percentage of aggregate marks obtained by him/her in 10+2 examination.
- 2. Written Test: 50 Marks

The written test is also used for the Screening the candidates. No re-evaluation on rechecking of marks is allowed for written test.

**NON- SUBSIDIZED SEATS:** For Non-Subsidized seats admission shall be based on the percentage of marks scored in Matric and 10+2 exam passed (carrying equal weightage). The candidates on merit depending upon the number of seats, shall be admitted to the course and there will not be any kind of reservation.

## Semester system and Choice Based Credit System.

#### ANTI RAGGING/ DISCIPLINE RULES

In order to have zero tolerance and its total elimination from educational institutions, Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide its orders dated 4th May, 2001, 16th May 2007 and 11th Feb, 2009 has directed as here under:

- 1. Ragging is banned in the institution.
- 2. Anyone indulging in ragging is liable to be punished appropriately. Punishment shall be exemplary and justifiably harsh.
- 3. Punishment for ragging includes:
  - i) Imprisonment, fine or both
  - ii) Expulsion from the institution, suspension from the institution or classes for limited period or a fine with a public apology.
  - iii) With holding scholarships or other benefits.
  - iv) Debarring from representation on participation in events.
  - v) With holding of results.
  - vi) Suspension or expulsion for hostel or mess and the like.
- 4. In case the applicant for admission is found indulged in ragging/indiscipline in the past or if it is noticed later that he has indulged in ragging, admission may be refused or he/she will be expelled from the institution forthwith.

The committee will keep a continuous watch and vigil over Ragging. The committee shall promptly deal with incident of Ragging brought to its notice and summarily punish the Guilty either by itself or by putting forth its findings/recommendations/suggestions to the Principal.

#### HOSTEL

The college has Girls Hostel with a capacity to accommodate 91 students. Hostel is allotted on academic merit basis. The following rules are to be observed strictly by the hostel inmates:

The Hostel warden appoints a hostel Prefect who looks after the discipline and daily attendance of the girls.

- \* The mess is run on cooperative basis
- \* No inmate is allowed to use electric appliances in the room.
- \* Entry of outsiders in the hostel is strictly prohibited.
- \* Use of drugs or intoxicants, smoking and ragging in the hostel are offences which can result in the eviction of the offender from the hostel.
- \* Pets are not allowed in the hostel.
- \* No boarder is allowed to proceed to her native place prior permission of Hostel warden.
- \* On leaving/vacating the hostel, the boarder shall have to procure a "No Dues Certificate" from the Hostel.


