SECTION -I INTRODUCTION

1. Establishment at a glance

The establishment being named after a great visionary, spiritual leader Swami Vivekananda has been established with the state government notification on dated July 1st, 1994 for running arts faculty only. The majestic and well designed building of the college was built by ACC and was handed over in 1999. Science and commerce faculties were started in 1998. The college is affiliated to H.P. University and was given due recognition under UGC section of 12(B) in 2008 and in 2 (F) in 2009. Two new vocational courses BCA and PGDCA were started in 2009 under self financing scheme. In the year 2012 M.A. English was started. In the same year another vocational course BBA was started under self financing scheme. In the year 2019, NAAC team visited the college and the institution was accredited as "B grade" institution. Three more PG courses M.Sc. Chemistry, Botany and zoology were introduced in 2020. At present the college is spread over 73.11 bighas of land the entire campus of college is under CCTV surveillance and is connected to Wi-Fi and broadband internet system. During covid-19 pandemic all necessary SOP followed by institute.

At present about three thousand students coming from far-flung rural areas are studying in various UG and PG courses being run by this college. The college has well-furnished laboratories in the Science faculty and also in the Departments of Geography, Music and Computer Applications. It has a girl's hostel having capacity to accommodate 91 girls' students. It has its own well-furnished gymnasium, examination hall, conference hall and Boxing ring.

The college has a well-stocked library. The library has been shifted to a new building. The construction work of the new commerce block has processed.

The college is dedicated to the cause of learning by imparting education to inculcate a sense of responsibility devotional service among the students. The college provides a blend of academic, cultural, sports and intellectual resources. It also brings to the students a dynamic environment for the overall development of their personalities, aspirations and talents. In nut shell today, the college is known as one among the finest institutions in the state for Sciences, Humanities and Commerce...

Over the years, the college has shown consistently very good results as compared to H.P.U. pass percentage and every year students of this college get positions in the merit list is notified by H.P.

1. Research Design

It provides the empirical and consistent basis for drawing the conclusions.

Need for the survey

Feedback survey gives clear guidance on how to improve students' learning, awareness and teachers-students' relationship. No matters that how highly an institution is graded, it is not greater than its students because students are the factors that make the institution come alive. Student satisfaction refers to the attraction, pride, or positive feelings that students develop towards a particular program or institution. Student satisfaction surveys helps to measure the effectiveness of classroom teaching and the student feedback provide a roadmap to gauge different alternative methods to make education more effective. Student satisfaction tries to identify and implement the multi-faceted areas of development. Swami Vivekananda Government Degree College is no exception to conduct student satisfaction surveys. The practice of analyzing student feedback on different aspects of the institution is being done annually. After taking into consideration the comments of previous NAAC report the institution has extended the practice of analyzing feedback to alumni and teachers of the college also to make the survey more significant.

- ❖ To examine the perception and satisfaction level of alumni towards campus facilities and teaching learning process of Swami Vivekananda Government Degree College Ghumarwin.

- ❖ To analysis the perception and satisfaction level of teachers towards different aspects of curriculum taught, problem faced by teachers of SVGC Ghumarwin
- ❖ To study the perception and satisfaction level of parents towards different aspects of campus facilities and teaching learning process of swami Vivekananda Government Degree College Ghumarwin.
- ❖ To invite suggestions and recommendations from students, alumni, parents and teachers for the comprehensive development of institution.

Scope of survey

Scope of a study acts like boundary walls of an investigation beyond which the investigator can't exercise and results can't be generalised. The scope of the present survey is confined to a random sample of 879 stakeholders (students, alumni, Parents and teachers) belonging to Swami Vivekananda Government Degree College Ghumarwin, Distt. Bilaspur H.P.




Figure 2.2: Profile of the student respondents




Figure 3.5: Satisfaction level of the students about Internet Facilities




Figure 3.6: Satisfaction level of the students about Canteen Facilities




Figure 3.7: Satisfaction level of the students about Transportation Facilities




Figure 3.8: Satisfaction level of the students about Sports Facilities




Figure 3.9: Satisfaction level of the students about Medical Facilities




Figure 3.10: Satisfaction level of the students about Career counselling/Guidance





Figure 3.15: Opinion of the students about Teachers ability to communicate online mode




Figure 3.17: Opinion of the respondents about discussion of performance in assignments with the students




Figure 3.18: Opinion of the students about promotion of internship, student exchange and field visits by SVGC Ghumarwin




Table 3.19: Opinion of the students about providing multiple opportunities to learn and grow




Figure 3.20: Opinion of the students about discussion with students about their expected competencies, course outcomes and programme outcomes by the teachers




Figure 3.21: Opinion of the students about ability of teachers to identify and overcome the weaknesses of students




Figure 3.21: Opinion of the students about encouragement by teachers to participate in extracurricular activities




Figure 3.22: Opinion of the students about efforts by SVGC Ghumarwin to inculcate soft skills.




Figure 3.23: Opinion of the students about use of ICT tools during teaching (like LCD.




Figure 24: Opinion of the students about learning through online mode of teaching during the Covid-19 Pandemic




Figure 3.25: Opinion of the Students in context to teaching platforms




Figure 3.26: Perception of Students about whether "Teaching-Learning Process of SVGC




Figure 3.27: Opinion of respondents towards College campus Environment




Figure 3.28: Opinion of respondents towards College Teaching Standards




Figure 3.29: Opinion of respondents towards Quality of Lab Training in the college




Figure 3.30: Opinion of respondents towards Student Amenities provided by the college




Figure 3.32: Opinion of respondents towards Overall rating of Teachers of SVGC Ghumarwin




Figure 3.33: Opinion of respondents towards Overall rating of SVGC Ghumarwin


Figure 3.35: Satisfaction with the contents of syllabus taught by teachers








Figure 3.39: Opinion of the teachers regarding statement "CBCS is better than Previous





Figure 3.41: Opinion of the teachers regarding prefer method for online class




Table 3.43: Opinion of teachers regarding understanding of asynchronous class





Figure 3.44: Opinion of teachers regarding "Whether the asynchronous class is better for students with unstable internet connection




Figure 3.46: Opinion of teachers regarding their preference of online teaching platform




Figure 3.47: Opinion of teachers regarding challenges faced to meet the learning outcomes on online mode.




Figure 3.49: Opinion of the Parent's regarding College infrastructure facilities




Figure 3.50: Opinion of the Parent's "Whether the communication is smooth between teacher and student"




Figure 3.51: Opinion of the Parent's "Whether the child is motivated by teachers for learning"




Figure3.52: Opinion of Parent's "Whether institute provides multiple opportunities to learn and grow




Figure 3.53: Opinion of the Parent's regarding satisfaction level with online teaching




Figure 3.54: Opinion of the Parent's "Whether they are satisfied with platform used in online teaching by teachers"




Figure 3.55: Opinion of the Parent's "Whether they are financially sound to provide Smart




Figure 3.56: Opinion of the Parent's regarding time spend by their child on smart devices for studying every day

Section-IV

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTIONS

The present survey has been undertaken with the objectives to study the perception and satisfaction level of students and alumni towards campus facilities and teaching learning process of Swami Vivekananda Government Degree College Ghumarwin and to check the perception and satisfaction level of teachers towards different aspects of curriculum taught by teachers. The present survey is based on an overall sample of 879 respondents including students, alumni, Parents and teachers of different departments of SVGC Ghumarwin during 2020-21. The results of this survey are summarised as under:

Student survey analysis shows that most of the students are satisfied with college infrastructure facilities except internet/Wi-Fi facilities, Library seating capacity. Students are fully satisfied with the Sanitization and Thermal scanning facilities provided by the institution during the Covid -19 pandemic as college followed the SOP's issued by Ministry of Health and Government of Himachal Pradesh to the Educational institutions with true spirit. Students are satisfied with the teacher's ability to communicate through online mode and encouraged, motivated for online engagement and learning. The most of students agreed with the statement that the assessment and Examination System of college is very good and internal assessment was fair as per their performance. Majority of teachers i.e. 72.1 percent prefer lecture to explain everything in real time class. Teachers and students both prefer Google meet platform for online teaching whereas most of the teachers faced challenges like Lack of response from students, high absenteeism, and poor internet connectivity. From Alumni feedback analysis we found that they are highly satisfied with the amenities provided by the institution and the institution also has positive public image. Parents are content with online teaching and stressed over taking online tests, assignments, quizzes on regular basis. Majority of the teachers showed dissatisfaction with course contents in context of employability skills and showed a strong need to start some additional value added job oriented courses in existing curriculum. Most of respondents have labelled the SVGC Ghumarwin is best college in the area and growing well as per its core values. There is a cordial teaching learning environment in the institution as a result of:

- 1. Meeting the idiosyncratic needs of students and faculties for improved performance.
- 2. Supporting with resources and Provide useful feedback at the appropriate level and time
- 3. Modelling a belief that individuals in the organisation can grow and improve with support and targeted professional development.

Suggestions

Suggestion are received from stakeholders (Students, Teachers, Alumni and parents)

- 1) Teacher Students taught ratio should be improved for better quality education.
- 2) Library seating capacity should be increased.
- 3) E-Library facilities should be developed (Access to reputed Journals/Books/Magazines etc.)
- 4) Separate Building and Labs should be for the Post Graduation courses.
- 5) Virtual Smart classrooms should be there for each department for online teaching.
- 6) Online test, Assignments, Presentations, should be taken into practice on regular basis.
- 7) Sports infrastructure need to enhance (Playground for Track & field Events).
- 8) The institution must have an App or Website for online teaching and a server for data handling/storage which facilitate students to access study material anytime.
- 9) There should be an online teaching training programme for teachers by the institution so that can effectively take online classes.
- 10) Job oriented courses/ programme should be introduced by the institution.
