



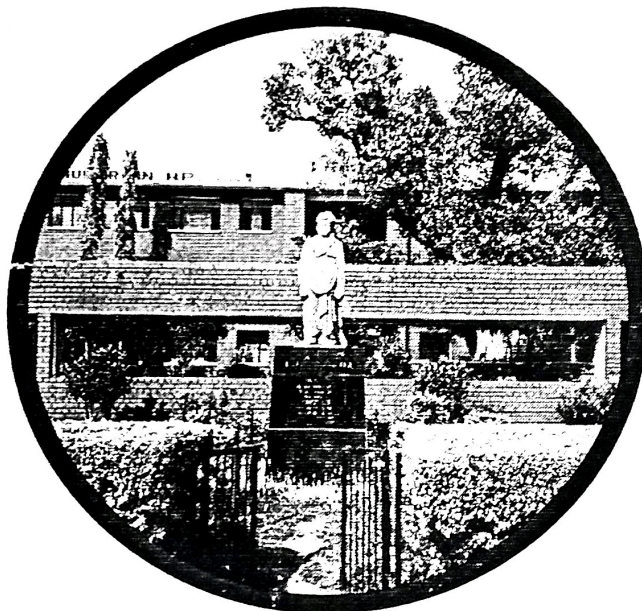

**Introduction:** Swami Vivekanand Government College, Ghumarwin came into being on July 1994 with the notification of the Government of Himachal Pradesh. Since its establishment, the college has proliferated and has progressively made its mark as one of the eminent educational institutions of higher learning for sciences, humanities, and commerce, with the focus on the culture of excellence, that permeates every classroom and department, a focus on not simply getting educated but creating a lifelong passion for learning and inculcating human values.

The exalted and beautiful building of the college was built by ACC and the college is affiliated to H.P. University Shimla-5. The college got affiliated under articles 2 (f) and 12 (B) of the University Grants Commission in 2009 and has been accredited as a grade B institution by the AAC in 2020. The entire campus of the college is under CCTV surveillance and connected to Wi-Fi. Flowers, trees, green lawns and shrubs keep the campus clean, green and beautiful enough to captivate everyone. The college has adequate infrastructure in terms of classrooms, laboratories, library, canteen and playground. It has its own gymnasium and girls' hostel. The college offers professional courses like BBA, BCA, PGDCA and B. Voc. Master's degree courses in eight subjects work as a feather in the cap. The college is adorned with modern labs for Physics, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Geography, Language Lab, GIS Lab and air-conditioned labs for Information and Technology. A study center of IGNOU is also functioning in the college.

#### College Library:

An educational institute cannot be imagined without a library. Our college library is well equipped with learning resources. During the session 2022-23, it possessed 12930 textbooks, 608 reference books, 7 journals and 3 magazines for the benefit of the students and faculties.

#### Girls Hostel:

The college has hostel facility for tribal girl students. In the current session there are 84 girls in the hostel (6 ST, SC and 69 of general category). Girls from tribal areas and scheduled caste category are given priority in the hostel admission, while general category girls students are provided admissions on merit basis only with the condition of seats lying vacant. At present 72 girls from Science, 12 from Arts stream out of which 61 are from UG courses and 23 from UG courses.

#### Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) Centre:

Prof. Bachan Singh Thakur is the coordinator of IGNOU. Since October 2010, a centre of Indira Gandhi National Open University is functional in the college. Students, working people of the area and others who could not complete their education through regular mode, can enroll themselves for different courses. Courses available through IGNOU centre include BA, B.Com, BTS, DTS, CTS and CHR.



During this session, 292 Fresh student and 188 students re-registered themselves in this centre.

### Higher education Institute Society (HEIS)

Under the aegis of HEIS of the college, Job oriented courses like BBA, BCA, and PGDCA are being run to benefit those students of this region who cannot study professional courses due to a lack of financial resources. All the courses of this society are affiliated to HP University. The Society has well-qualified staff, a library, laboratories, and other infrastructural facilities. In this session, 280 students were enrolled in these courses in the college. Prof. Suresh Sharma is a member secretary of HEIS.

### NCC

NCC Army wing is working under the able guidance and potential leadership of Associate NCC Officer (Dr.) Jai Chand Mehalwal. There is total 54 cadets authorized strength in this college. NCC cadets are actively participating in various types of activities in college as well as in the surrounding areas for awareness campaigns. First time our four girl cadets participated in Army Attachment camp at Pathankot. Our cadet Kanika bagged second positions in Rangoli competition at state level, while cadet Gaurav Dhiman participated in seminar National integration Camp at Kakinada. #### **Session 2022-23 Activities**

Red Ribbon Club of SVGC College organized various activities in the college. In addition to these activities members of our club took participated in the various activities organized at the state and district level.

- Red Ribbon Club organized Seminar Cum Poster Making Competition On the occasion of World Vaccine Day (18<sup>th</sup> May) on 18<sup>th</sup> -May-2022. In which around 90 students and faculty members took part in this competition.

### Gender Champion Club 2023

A Gender champion club has been constituted in the college to sensitize the students of the college towards gender issues. There are 51 students enrolled in this club for the session 2022-23. Most of the members of this club are girls. The club organizes different activities inside or outside the college to raise awareness regarding the social and legal rights of girls and women. This club organizes various awareness programs and workshops for Gender equality in collaboration with the women's cell and the Department of Women and Child Welfare, Bilaspur.

### Activities 2022-23

A workshop on "Menstrual Hygiene and Personal Care" was organized in collaboration with an international health company on December 12, 2022. In this workshop representatives from the company demonstrated the proper use and disposal of sanitary napkins and the ways of taking care during periods. In this workshop 466 girls from different streams learnt about personal hygiene. In this program, members of Gender Champion club, SVGC Ghumarwin presented solo act on the mental state of a brother who got setback of the rape of his younger sister, who dies out of gang rape in her childhood.

### EEE- COURSE

HPKVN under the aegis of NSQF is imparting skill training in English, Employability and entrepreneurship for 5000 final year students of graduation from selected Govt. Degree Colleges in Himachal Pradesh to facilitate their transition into varied careers. HPKVN Plans and facilitate vocational training program for the youth of (H.P) with the objectives to enhance employability & provide their better placement. The training is also aimed at promoting entrepreneurship and establishment of small-scale business start-up. In SVGC Ghumarwin, 120 Students are enrolled under EEE program.

### Other Activities
