This college being named after a great visionary, spiritual leader Swami Vivekananda has been established with the state government notification on dated July 1st, 1994 for running arts faculty only. The majestic and well designed building of the college was built by ACC and was handed over in 1999. Science and commerce faculties were started in 1998. The college is affiliated to H.P. University and was given due recognition under UGC section of 12(B) in 2008 and in 2 (F) in 2009. Two new vocational courses BCA and PGDCA were started in 2009 under self financing scheme. In the year 2012 M.A. English was started. In the same year another vocational course BBA was started under self financing scheme. In the year 2017-18, PG in Mathematics and Physics were started and from the session 2019-20 M.Com and MA in Political Science has been started. In the year 2019, NAAC team visited the college and the institution was accredited as “B grade” institution. Three more PG courses M.Sc. Chemistry, Botany and zoology were introduced in 2020. At present the college is spread over 73.11 bighas of land the entire campus of college is under CCTV surveillance and is connected to Wi-Fi and broadband internet system.

At present **2664** students coming from far-flung rural areas are studying in various UG and PG courses being run by this college. The college has well-furnished laboratories in the Science faculty and also in the Departments of Geography, Music and Computer Applications. It has a girl’s hostel having capacity to accommodate 91 ‘girls’ students. It has its own well-furnished gymnasium, examination hall, conference hall and Boxing ring. The college has a well-stocked library. The library has been shifted to a new building. The construction work of the new commerce block has processed.

The college is dedicated to the cause of learning by imparting education to inculcate a sense of responsibility devotional service among the students. The college provides a blend of academic, cultural, sports and intellectual resources. It also brings to the students a dynamic environment for the overall development of their personalities, aspirations and talents. In nut shell today, the college is known as on among the finest institutions in the state for Sciences, Humanities and Commerce. Over the years, the college has shown consistently very good results as compared to H.P.U. pass percentage and every year students of this college get positions in the merit list is notified by H.P.

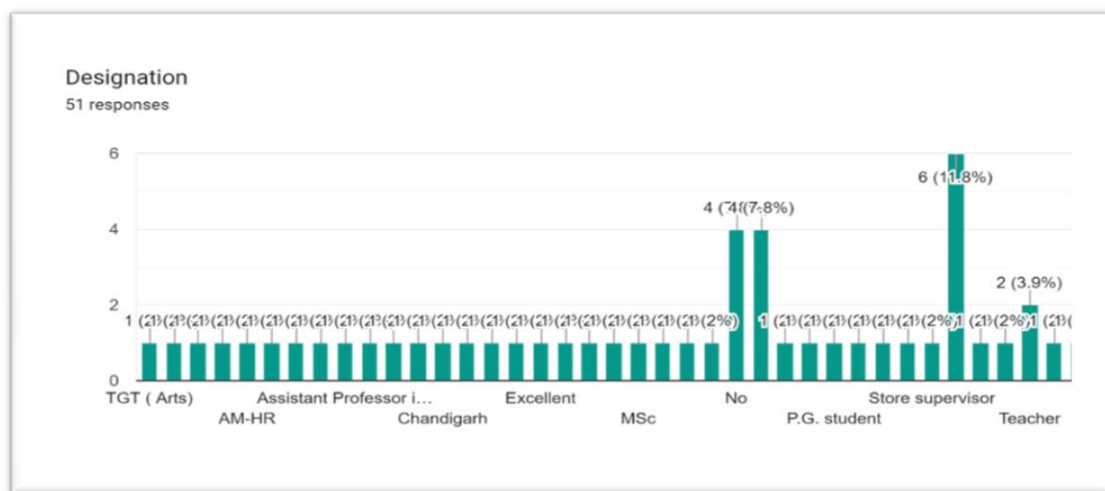
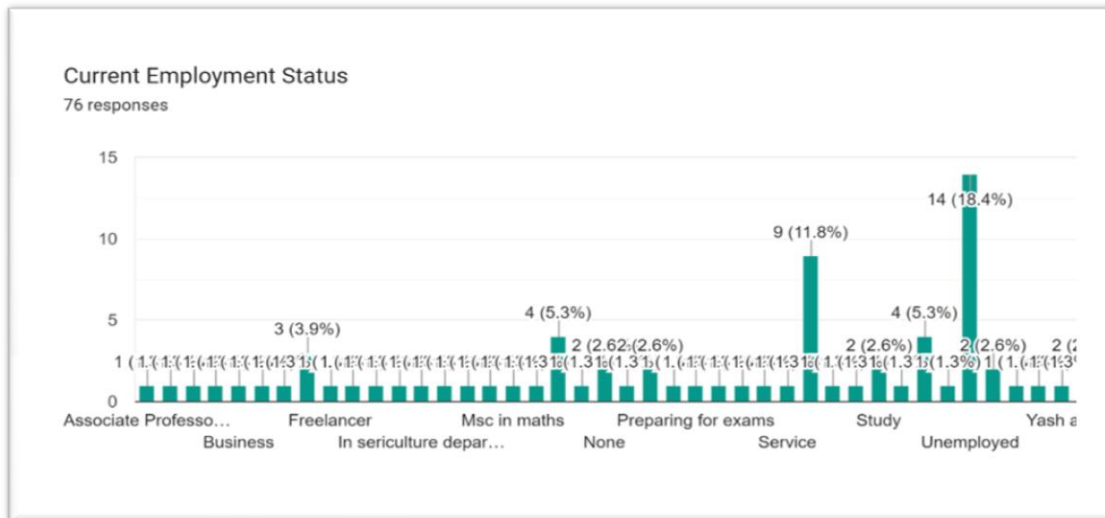
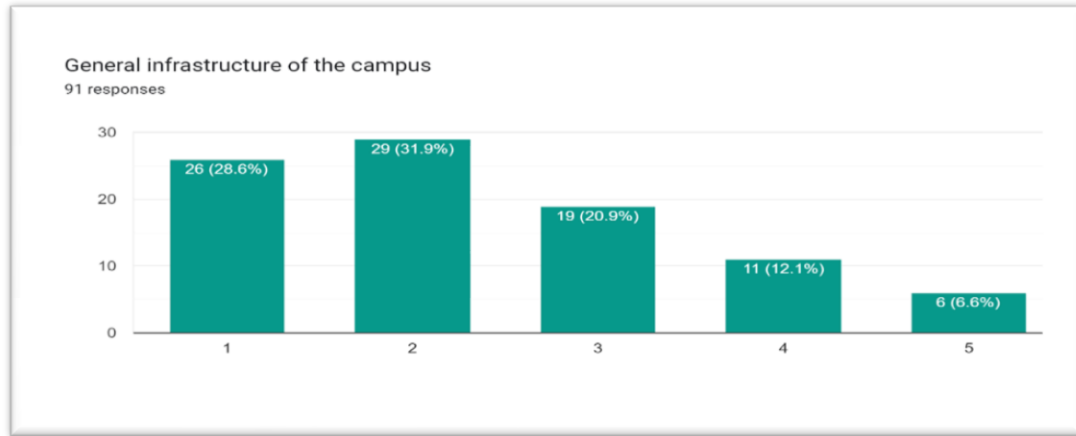


Exhibit18 Opinion of respondents towards quality of general infrastructure in the college

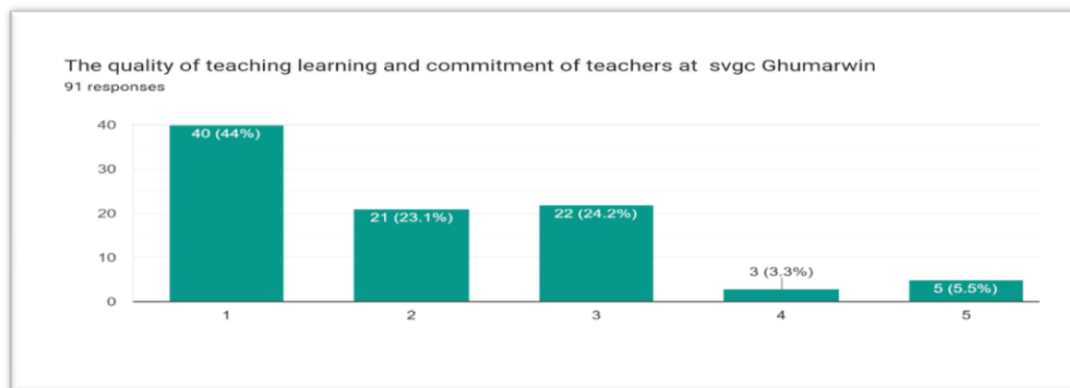

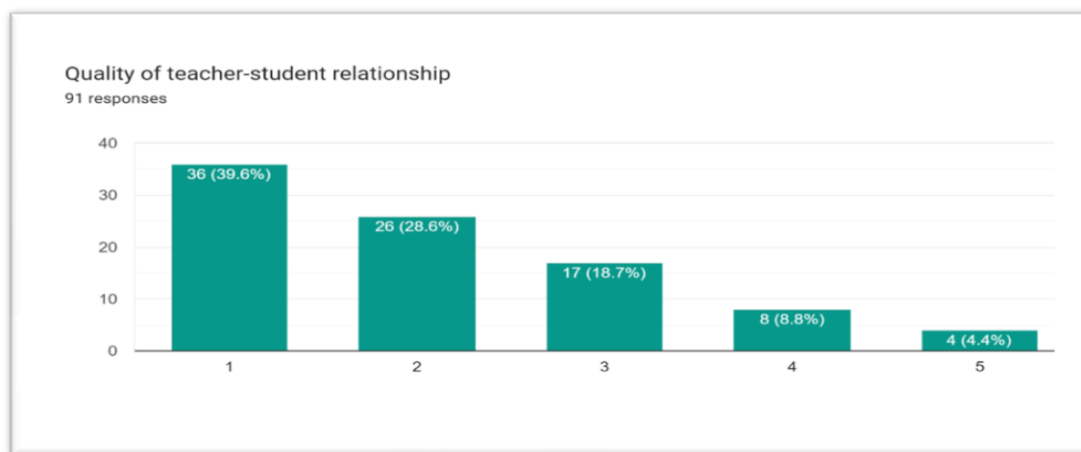

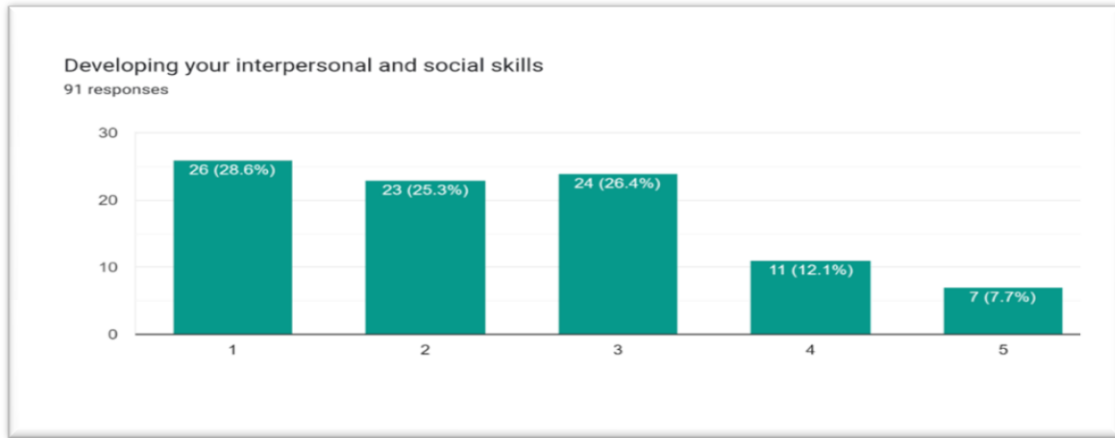

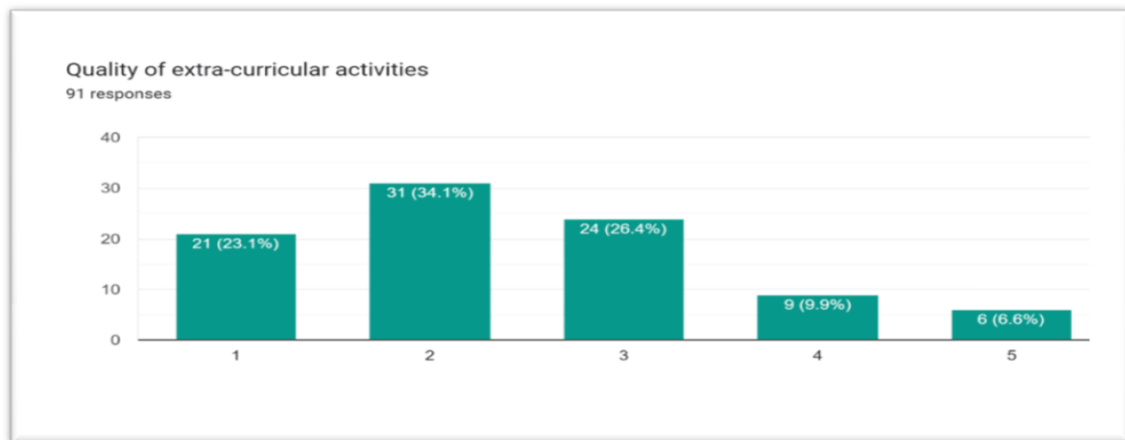

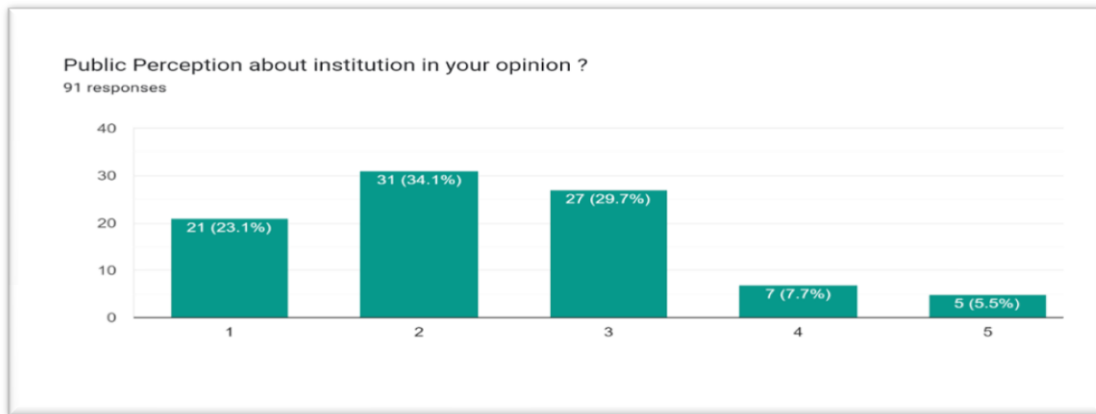

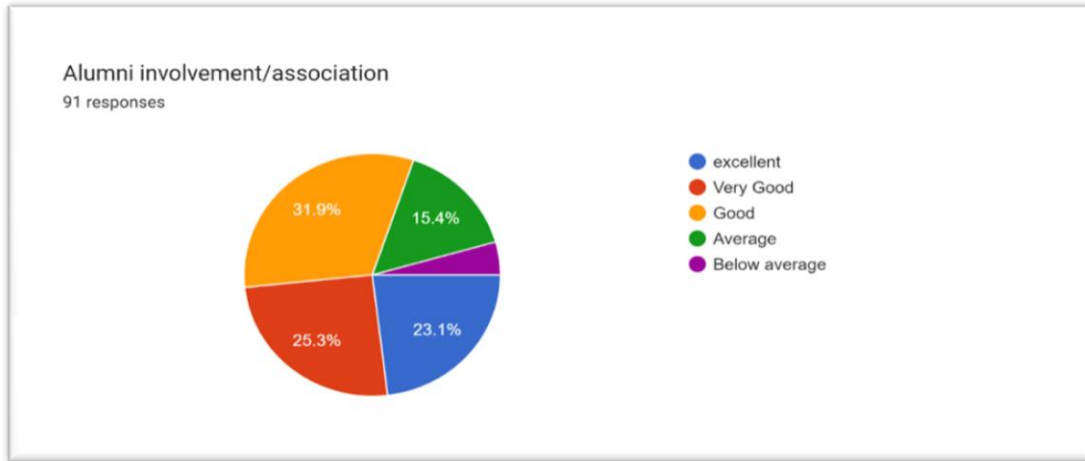

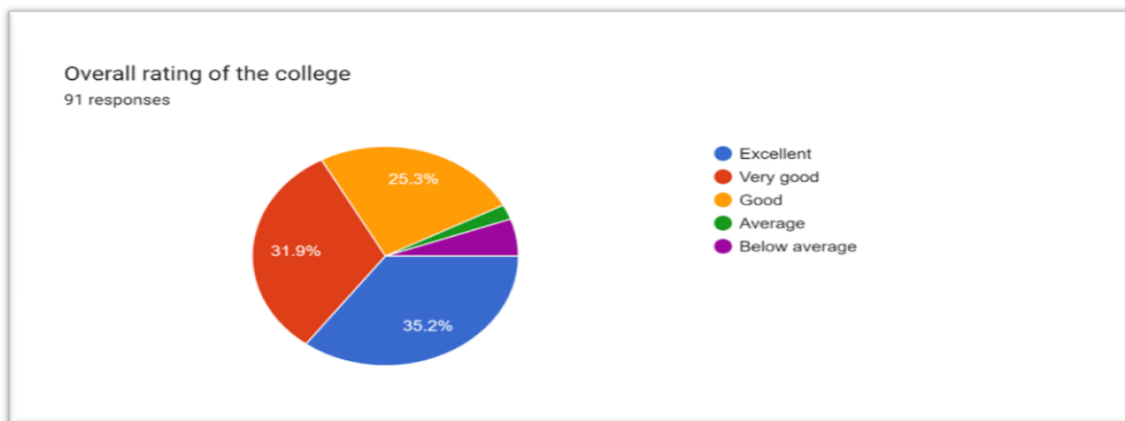

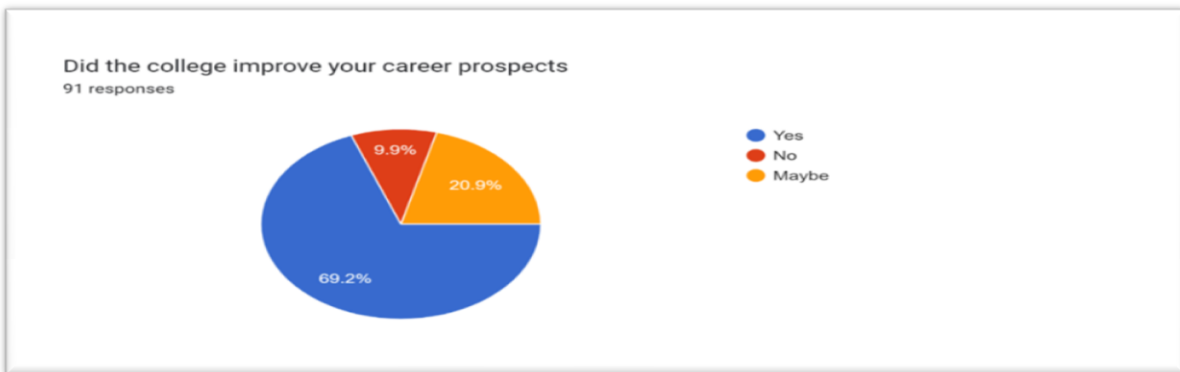

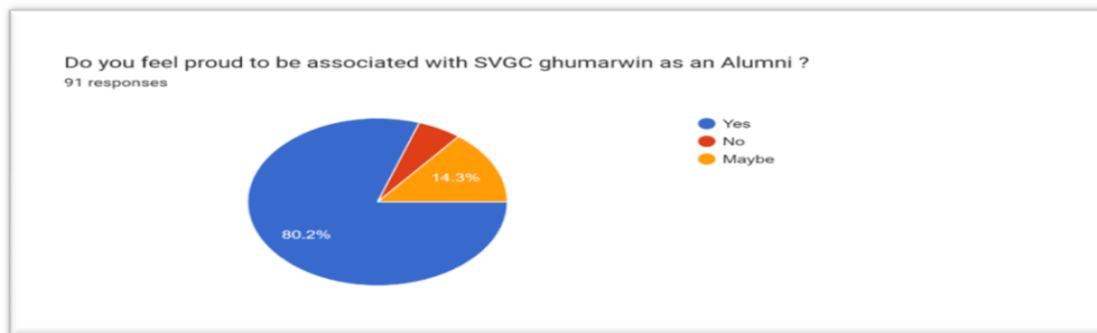

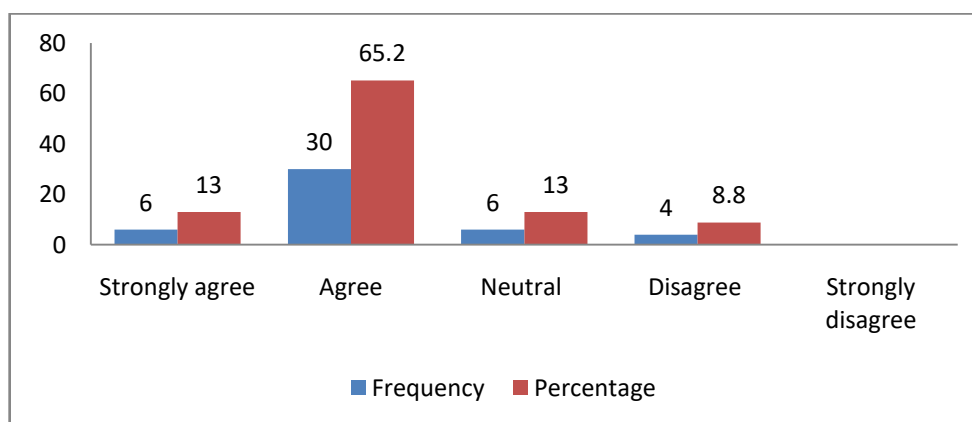
Analysis of the Teacher’s feedback on teaching and campus facilities of SVGC Ghumarwin:

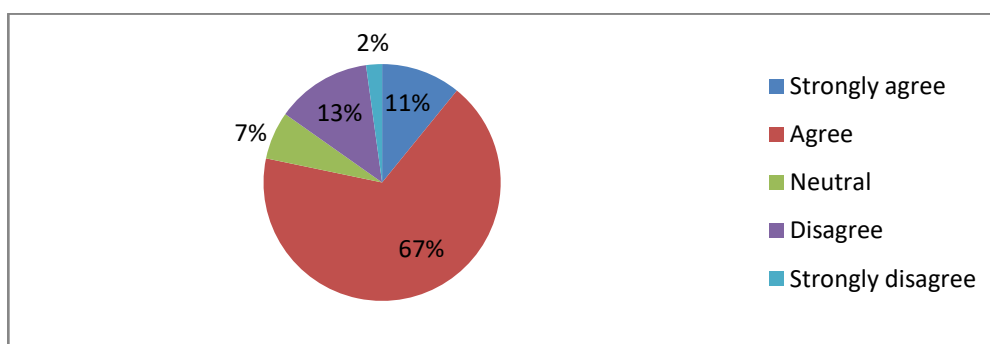

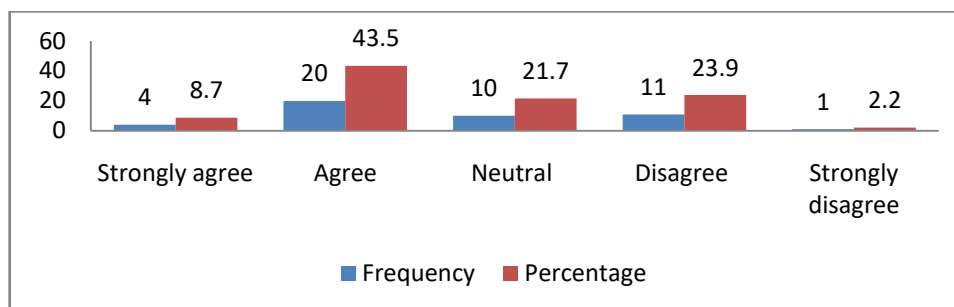

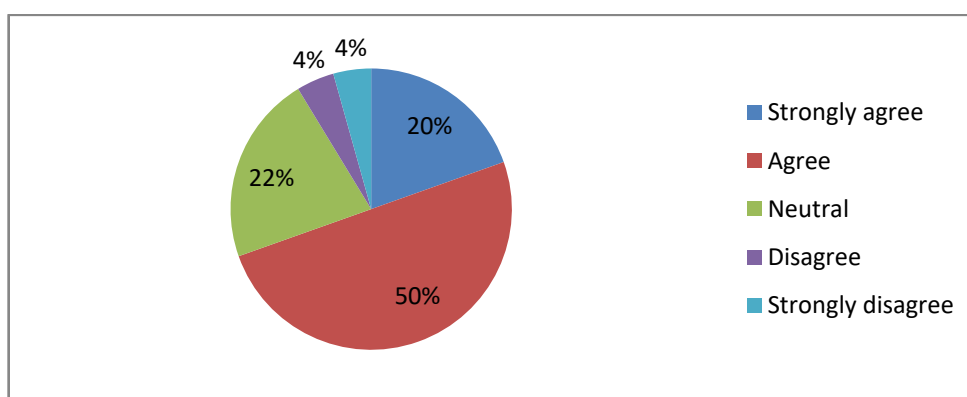

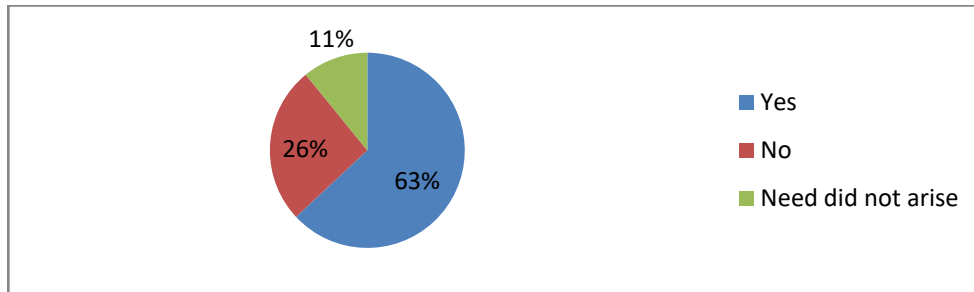

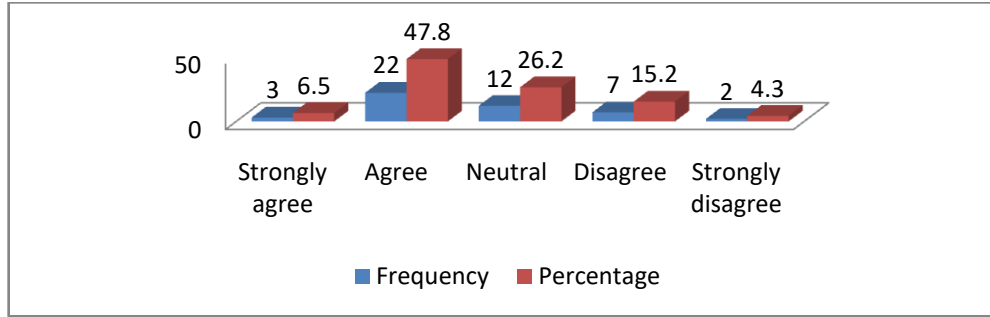

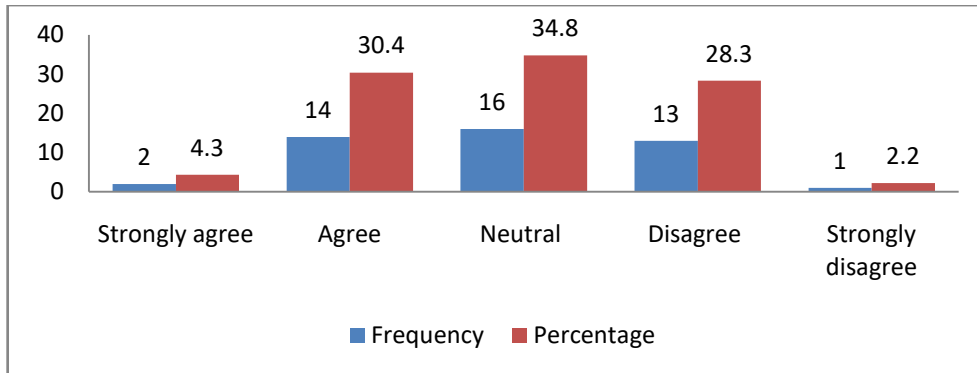

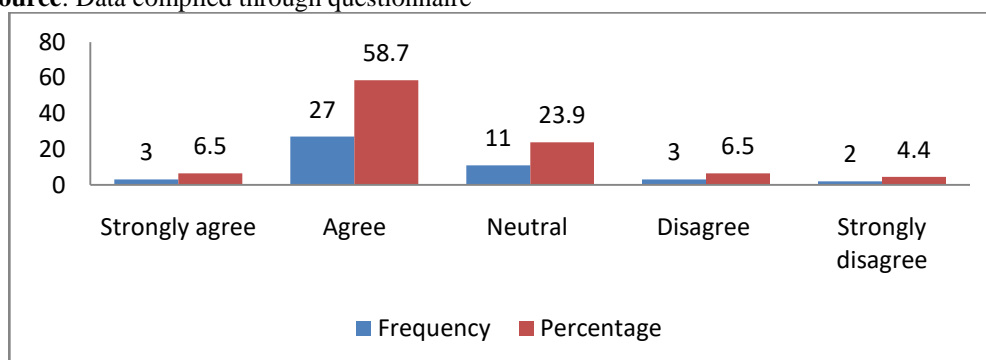

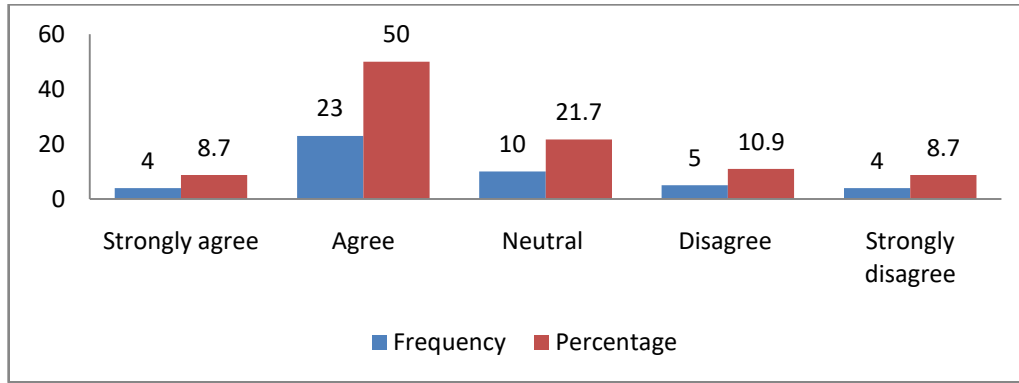

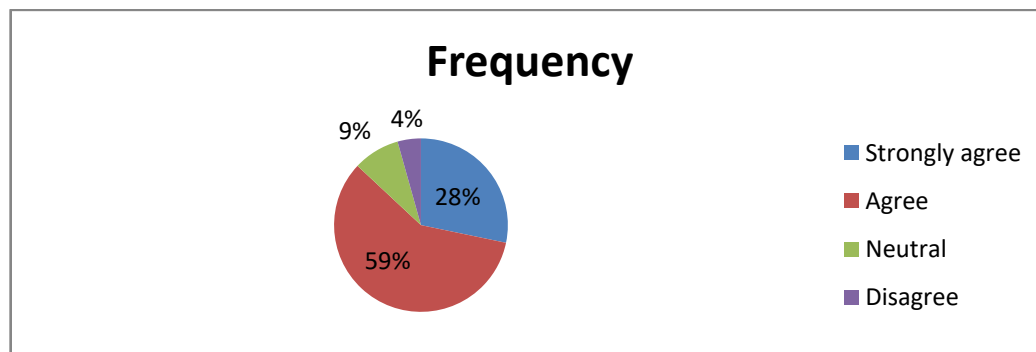

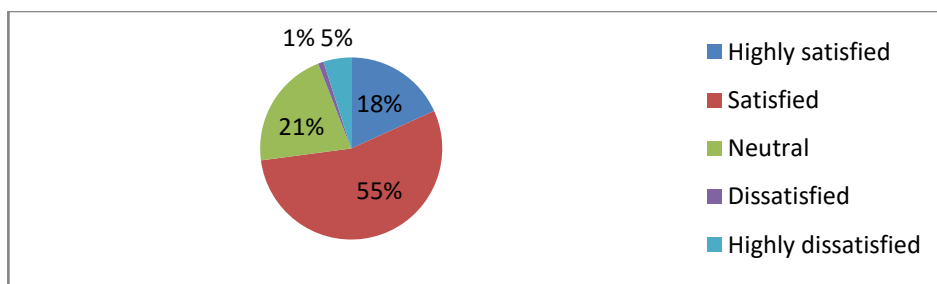

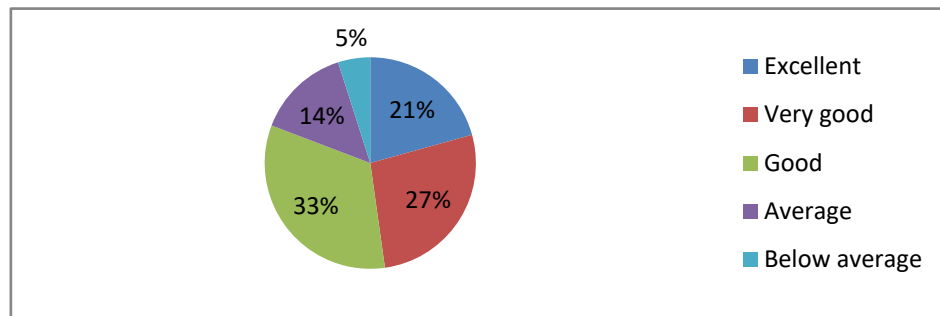

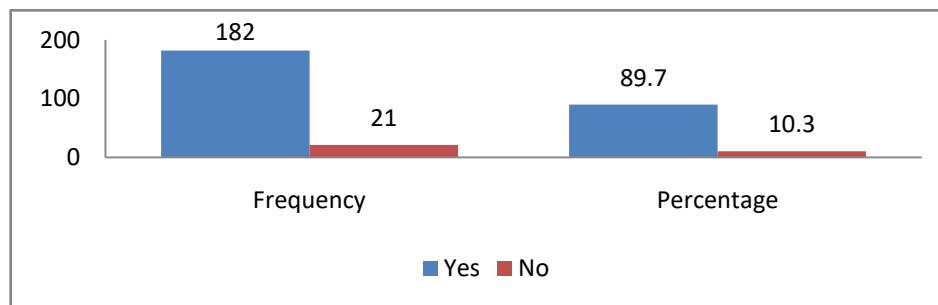

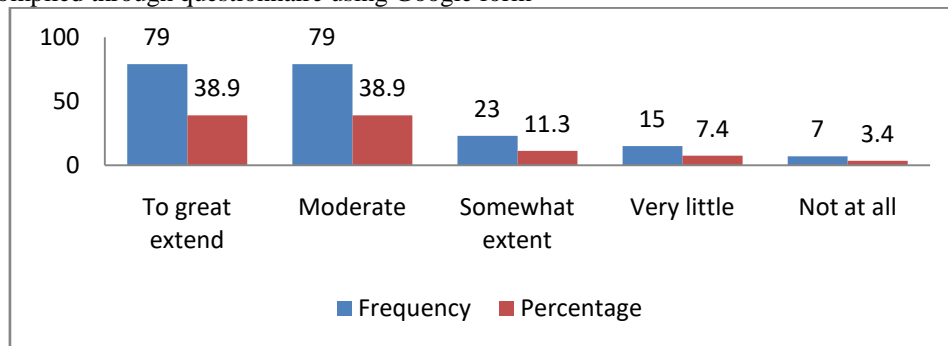

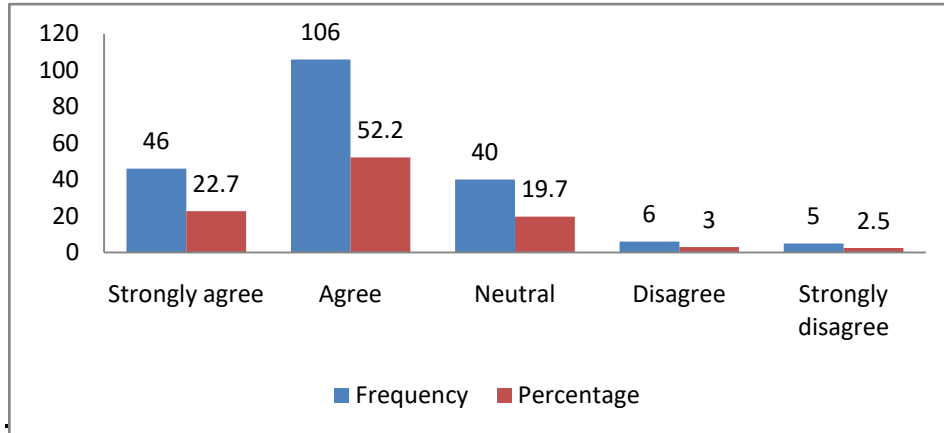

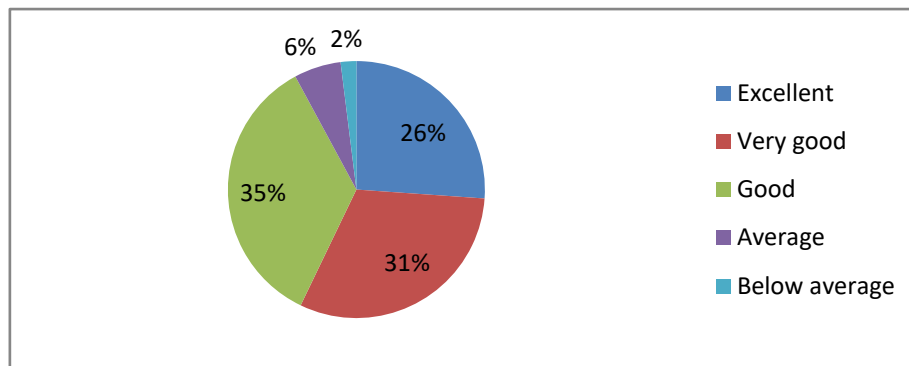

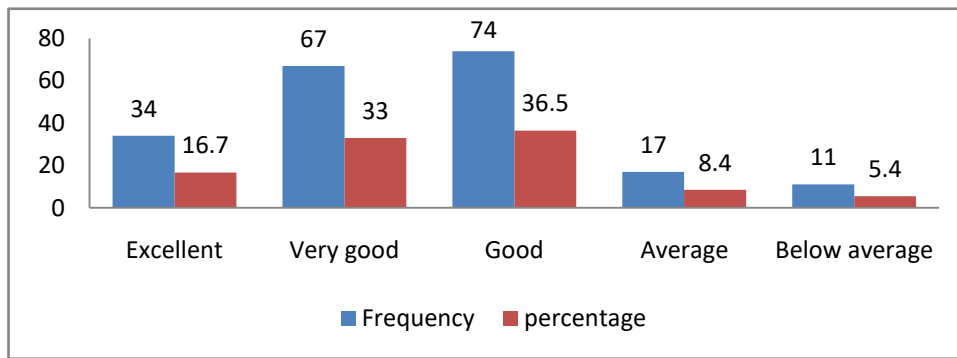

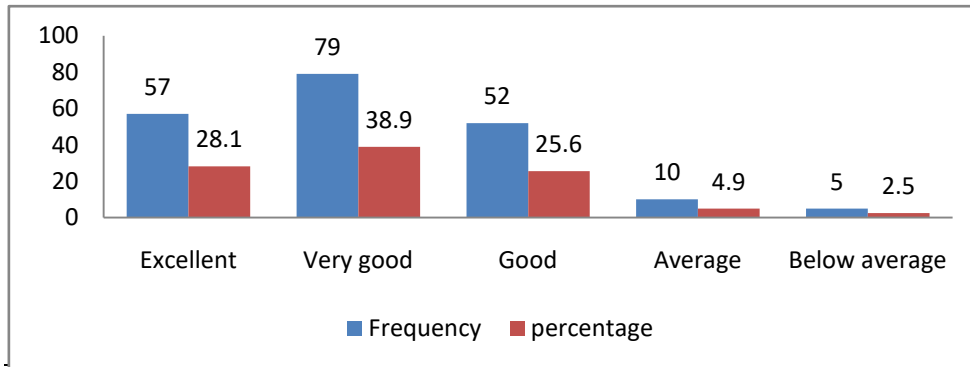

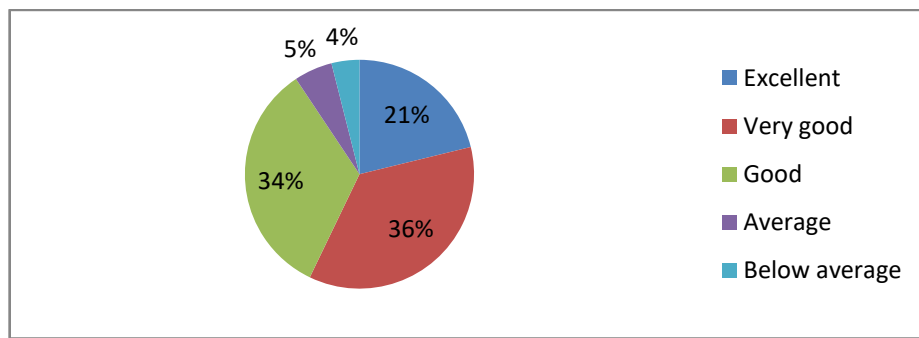

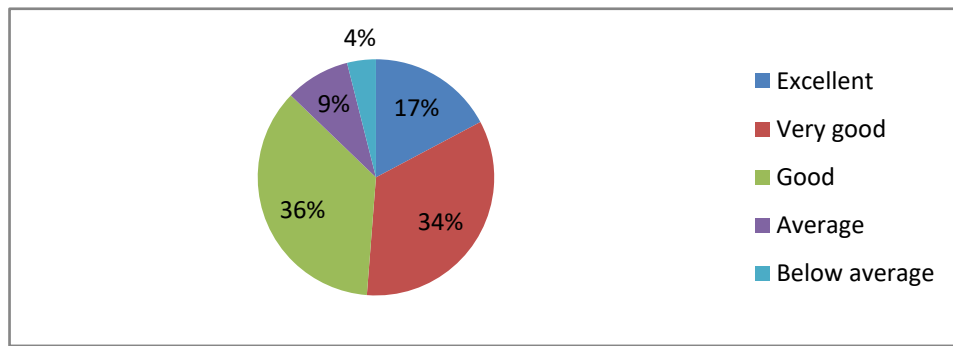

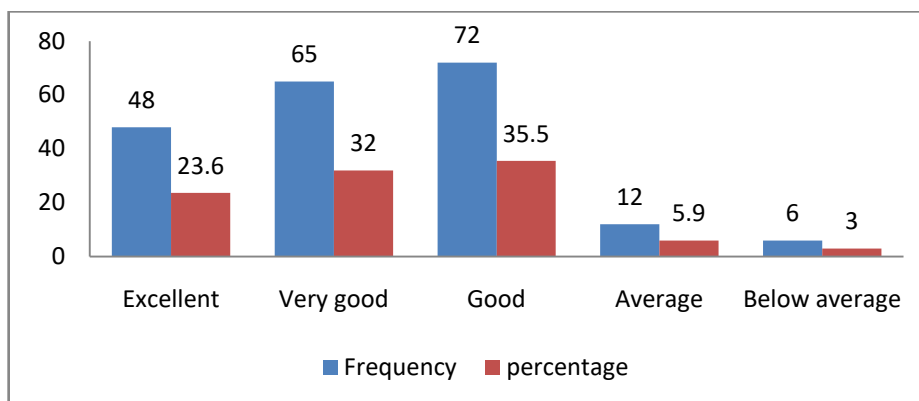

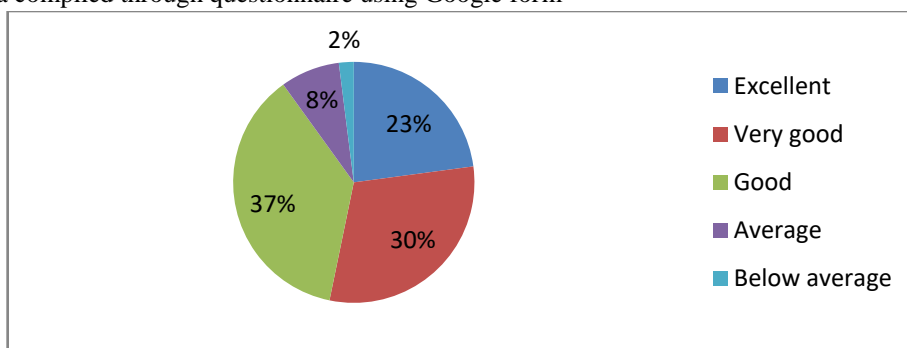

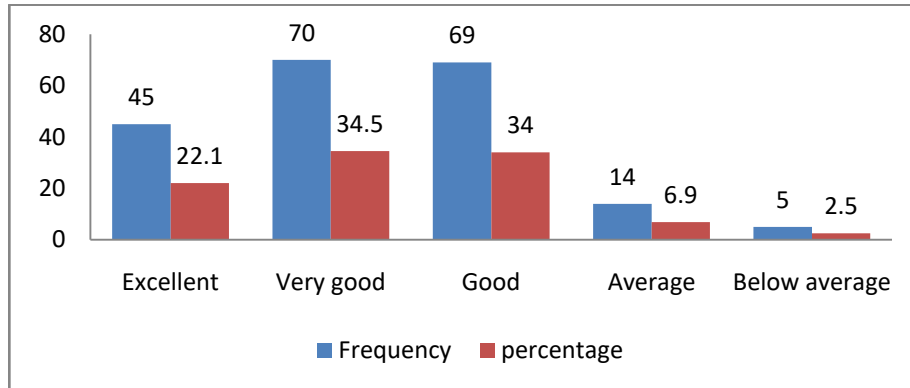

CONCLUSION AND SUGGESTIONS

The present survey has been undertaken with the objectives to study the perception and satisfaction level of alumni towards campus facilities and the teaching-learning process of Swami Vivekananda Government Degree College Ghumarwin and to check the perception and satisfaction level of teachers towards different aspects of the curriculum taught by teachers. The present survey is based on an overall sample of 340 respondents including alumni, teachers and parents. The results of this survey are summarised as under:


From Alumni feedback analysis we found that they are highly satisfied with the amenities provided by the institution and the institution also has a positive public image. Parents are content with online teaching and stressed over taking online tests, assignments, and quizzes regularly. The majority of the teachers showed dissatisfaction with course contents in the context of employability skills and showed a strong need to start some additional value-added job-oriented courses in the existing curriculum. Most of the respondents have labelled the SVGC Ghumarwin as the best college in the area and growing well as per its core values.


SUGGESTIONS

Suggestions are received from stakeholders (Teachers, Alumni and parents)

1. College should take up the matter of providing more faculty members in undergraduate and postgraduate programmes in order to improve teacher-student ratio and to provide high-quality education and research.
2. Regular career/job-oriented programmes and seminars should be organized.
3. Campus placement sessions should be planned in the institution.
4. To improve the learning experience, group discussions or hands-on demonstrations should be organized.
5. To improve students' access to digital resources and research materials, increase the number of computers and internet speed in the E-library and provide more e-resources in the E-library.
6. The library should have more books by international authors. Books other than the syllabus for skill or overall development will be made available in the library.
7. Parking facilities for students should be improved.
8. Institution should take steps to develop an online app for students' attendance and feedback.
9. Well-equipped laboratory facilities will be provided for UG/PG students to improve their practical knowledge.
10. To ensure hygiene and a well-maintained environment, the campus should be cleaned and beautified on a regular and comprehensive basis, including the classrooms and common areas.
11. More classrooms should be added for PG programmes and all classrooms should be equipped with LED projectors and interactive panels to improve the audio visual learning experience.
12. Programmes focusing on employment and skill development should be organized. Incorporate a life story of a prominent social reformer, leader, or scientist into the curriculum to instill moral and social values in students.

13. To encourage interest in sports, more sports infrastructure facilities/renovation of current facilities would be provided to students.
14. There should be efforts to enhance the amount of filtered drinking water to students. Proper water fixtures should be installed in boys' and girls' toilets.
15. Hostel facilities should be offered for boys, as well as for all needy girls.
16. A sufficient new technology infrastructure, including IT Labs, a media lab and on-campus media production software should be made available to students.
17. Students should have more opportunities for internships and industry training. Internships in the tourism industry should be arranged in the same way that those in the hospitality sector.
18. More extracurricular and co-curricular activities should be organized for students to showcase their talent.
19. ATM facilities should be available to students in college campus.
20. Syllabus to be employable, skill oriented and to inculcate social values among students.
21. Regular OSA meetings should be organized.
