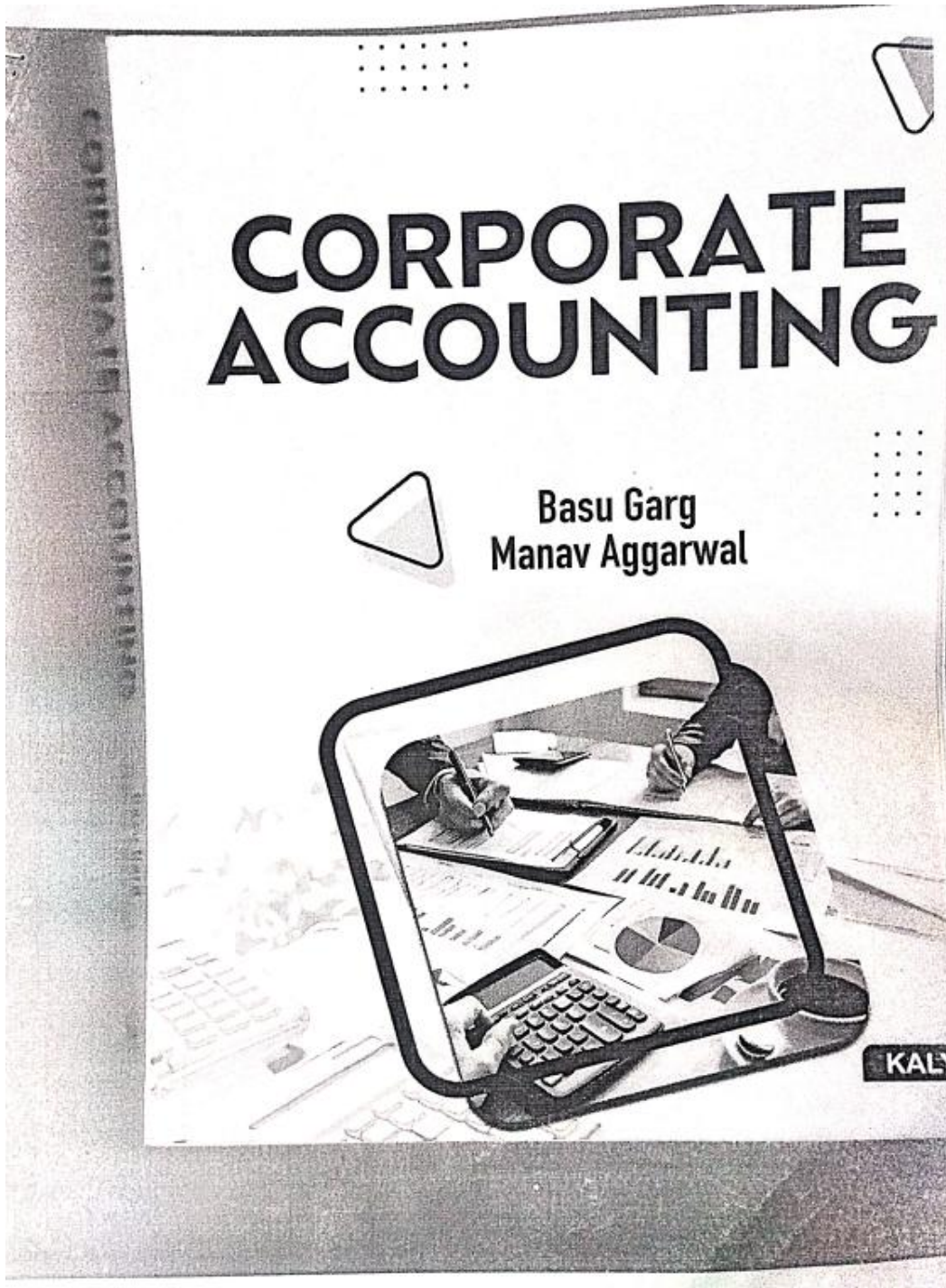

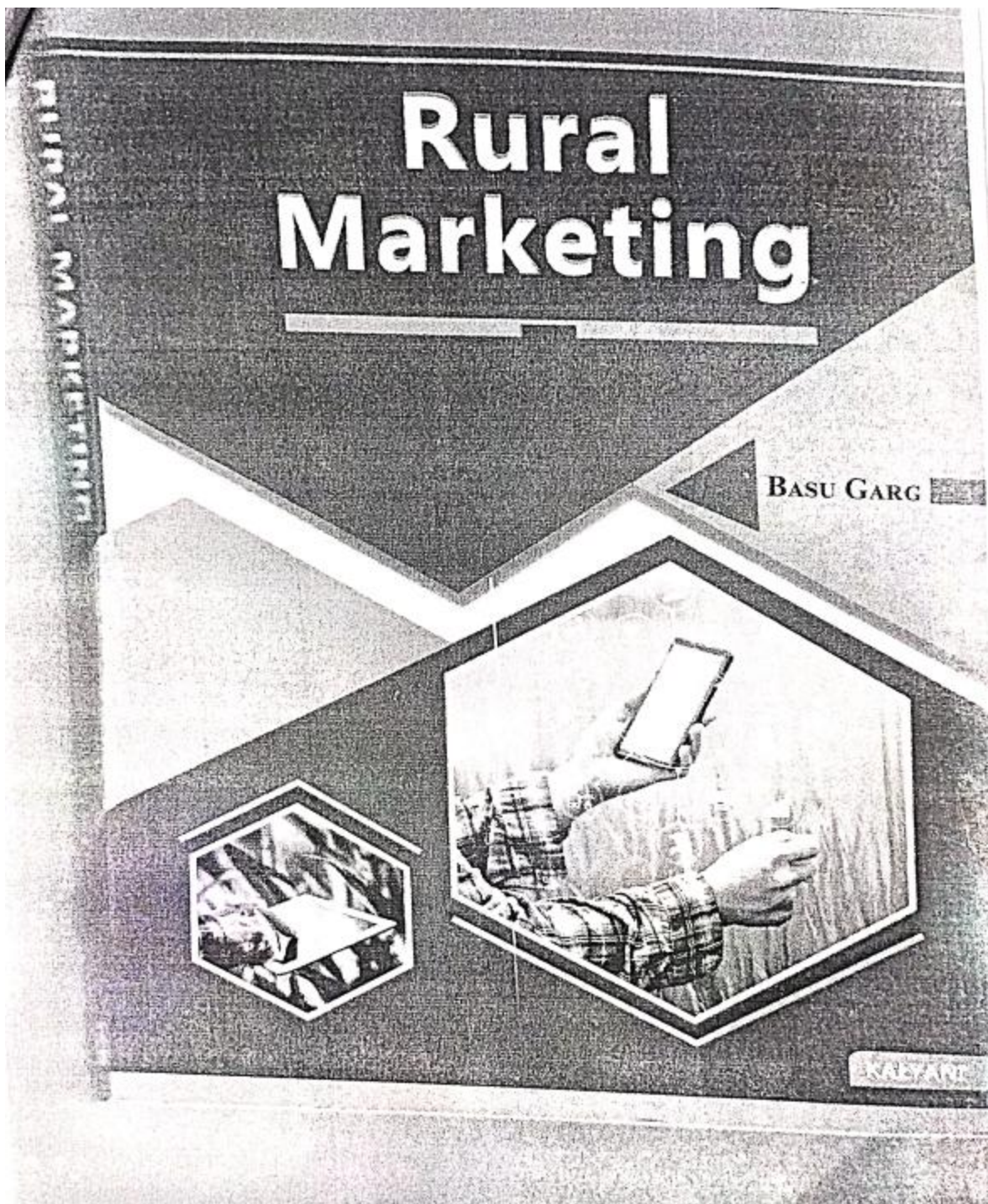

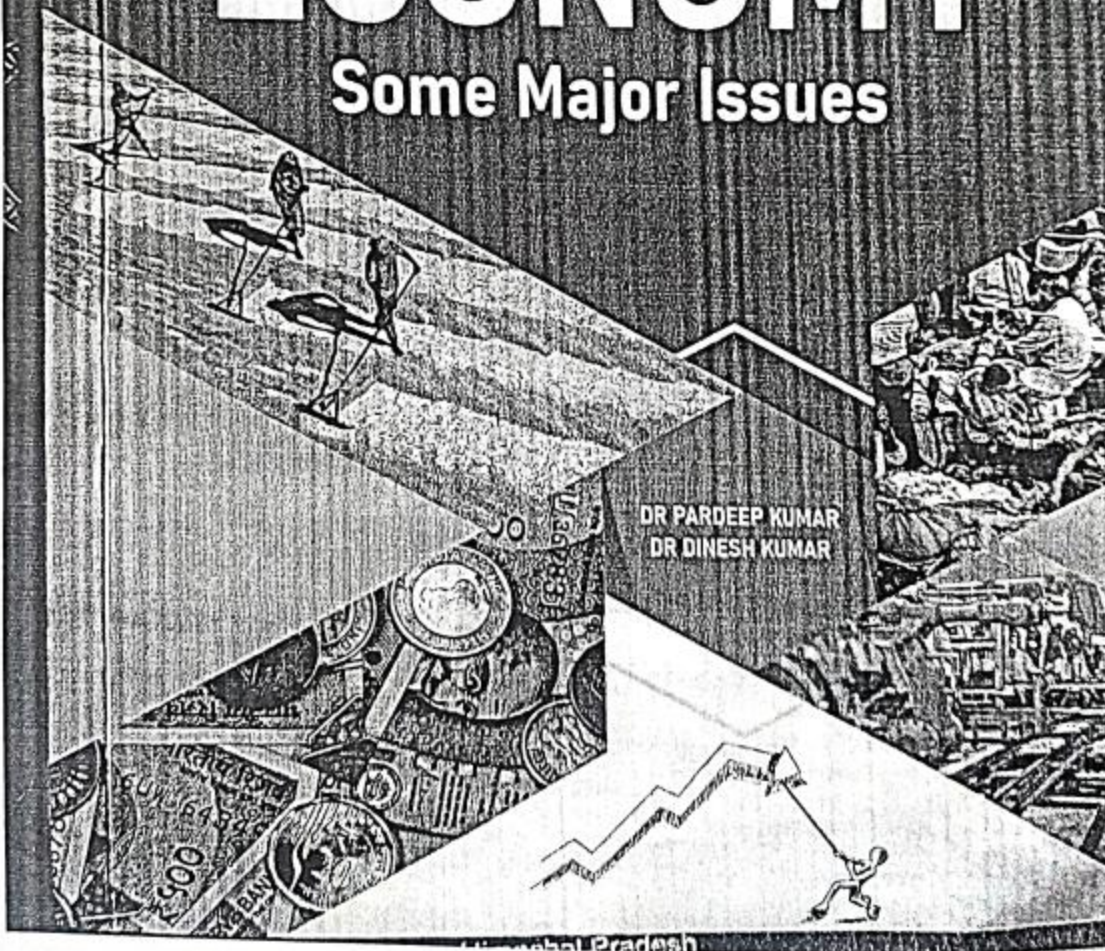

Food Security and Food Losses: An Analysis of India's State

Abstract

Food Security has remained the growing concern around the planet for the economic and political leaders even in the 21st century. Food Security has been viewed as the primary concern for all development and particularly humanistic development at all sphere and platform say Indian National Food Security Act 2010 (NFSA) and United Nation's Millennium Development Goal-1 (MDG) while specially in present scenario Russia Vs Ukrainian prolonged war has further aggravated the situation for the those who are on the border line. India claimed to be self-sufficed in food grains production since the day of Green Revolution and has been emerged as the net grain exporter by 2023. Today India's food grains production has gone up to charismatic high of about 273 MMT alongside the enhanced per capita annual food availability and daily per capita net availability. Analytical research into the Indian state portrays that despite sufficient food grain production, grains failed to enter the plate and goes waste due to faulty post-harvest mechanism caused interruption in supply chain. This interruption further causes the emergence of multiple snags into supply chain. It has cascading effects on livelihood concerns of farmers at farm and man with empty stomach at consumer end. A flash light has been thrown on the causes and a blend of strategic planning with remedial suggestions have been worked out and put forth to ensure minimal resources wastage between the ends i. e. farm and plate. Therefore, strategically and economical resource uses are imperative, to be surfaced for a food secure and sustainable future.
